Thank you for your email, and thank you for the advocacy you provide to all business owners in Canada and New Brunswick.

Our party believes strongly that businesses and entrepreneurs are the engines of prosperity in New Brunswick. At the moment, Brian Gallant's tax-and-spend approach has hurt businesses and taxpayers, while saddling the next generation with more and more debt. Our party will have a responsible plan to reduce the deficit over the next four years.

We are committed to working with small businesses to reduce the tax burden over our time in government. This will include the gradual elimination of the double tax and fighting a job-killing carbon tax. The carbon tax will increase costs by \$1200 per household and will turn away investment. We also plan to introduce a jobs tax credit that will provide a real boost to employment and business growth. Our government will push for free and fair trade across Canada, so that New Brunswickers can access markets across our great country.

Our party we work with stakeholders to improve our worker's compensation system so that businesses aren't unfairly impacted by massive rate increases.
