About the data in this report



Your Voice survey - final results for September 2022

- Type: An omnibus, controlled-access online CFIB survey.
- Active dates: September 8-26, 2022.
- Results: Based on responses from 3,679 CFIB members who are owners of Canadian independent businesses, from all sectors and regions of the country.
- For comparison purposes, a probability sample with the same number of respondents would have a margin of error of +/-1.6%, 19 times out of 20.





If the overall tax burden were reduced, business owners would prioritize increasing employee compensation and paying down their business debt (% response)





1 in 3 business owners have seen their commercial rent increase substantially over the past 12 months











9 in 10 owners are making changes in their business to deal with the impacts of inflation




Labour shortages





59% of business owners are currently experiencing labour shortages, while an additional 17% have had to adjust (e.g., increases in salary, hiring bonuses, etc.)



Of 59%, about 40% don't have all the staff needed for current operations, while 19% have all the staff needed to operate but cannot get the staff needed to expand.


- We don't have all the staff we need for current operations, due to labour shortages



■ Cannot fully operate □ Cannot expand



About 3 in 4 owners are working more hours to make up for labour shortages in their business (% response)



State of Small Business


Small businesses are still feeling the impacts of the pandemic, with more than half making less than normal sales (56%), just under two thirds still reporting pandemic related debt (64%) and about 3 in 4 indicating they are still under pandemic stress (77%).

As of September 2022, over 1 in 2 Canadian small businesses have not yet returned to normal revenues




56% of Canadian business are still not making normal sales, up 2 percentage points from June 2022.







Among businesses that are still holding debt incurred due to the pandemic (64%), the average amount held is \$143,771





A majority (55%) of businesses agree that their financial situation, including debts taken on due to the pandemic, continue to be a significant challenge for their business (By province and sector, % response)





77% of business owners are still under pandemic stress, with nearly 1 in 5 that have not recovered at all



(By province and sector, % response)








