

Why did you become a business owner? Select all that apply (in % of response)



'I am in business exclusively to make money'







About the CFIB member survey:

The results for the CFIB census survey were collected from may 7 to September 19, 2018 and are based on a sample of 3,151 small business owners from Canada.

For comparison purposes, a probability sample with the same number of respondents would have a margin of error of plus or minus 1,75 per cent, 19 times out of 20.



About the Angus Reid Forum:

The Angus Reid Forum is Canada's most well-known and trusted online public opinion community consisting of engaged residents across the country who answer surveys on topical issues that matter to all Canadians.

These are the findings of a study/survey conducted by CFIB from September 11 to 13, 2019 with a representative sample of n=1,510 online Canadians who are members of the Angus Reid Forum. The survey was conducted in English and French. The precision of Angus Reid Forum online polls is measured using a credibility interval. In this case, the poll is accurate to within +/- 1.8 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, had all Canadians been polled. All sample surveys and polls may be subject to other sources of error, including, but not limited to coverage error, and measurement error.
