

(% response)










Fully open, by province

(% response)









Fully open, by sector

(% response)





(% response)



Revenue drop test, by province



Revenue drop test, by sector




"I am behind in major bill payments (such as rent, credit cards, major suppliers)" (% response)



"I am behind in major bill payments (such as rent, credit cards, major suppliers)" (Agree, % response)





"I am considering bankruptcy/winding down my business as a result of COVID-19"



"I am considering bankruptcy/winding down my business as a result of COVID-19" (Agree, % response)





What worries you most about COVID-19?



If you could choose a few words that describe your current state of mind as a business owner, what would they be?



Business challenges as restrictions lift and economies reopen




Business challenges as restrictions lift and economies reopen Knowing the rules for businesses in my sector (% response)








For those that need/want to see changes to Canada Emergency Wage subsidy (CEWS): Changes that would help their business (Select all that apply)

A sliding scale that allows businesses to retain some of the subsidy as revenues increase









for a 20% drop in revenue
