

Tax Changes on the Way: survey


Survey Results

Methodology

- Online survey of CFIB members
- Two samples: business owners excluding tax practitioners (n = 8,553) and tax practitioners only (n = 410)
- Results from Sept. 6-14 (survey still ongoing)
- Backgrounder provided to all respondents
- Margin of error:
 - +/- 1.06 percentage points, 19 times out of 20 (business owners)
 - +/- 4.84 percentage points, 19 times out of 20 (tax practitioners)




If the federal government's set of proposed tax changes is implemented, to what extent do you agree or disagree with the following? (% response – business owners)


If the federal government's set of proposed tax changes is implemented, to what extent do you agree or disagree with the following? (% response – tax practitioners)

Overall, I do not support this set of proposed tax changes.



How significant are the proposed tax changes to your business? (% response – business owners)



How significant are the proposed tax changes to your small business clients? (% response – tax practitioners)





(% response – business owners)


